

Platignum maguscole 6ch to 9ch centurries

Letter height 5 pen widths



Serifs were formed in the sequence shown at left. Some steps omitted below in order to save space.



I think this is an authentic single-stroke method, used for speed but not where precision was demanded.

Basic pen angle: Horizontal to 20°. This alphabet lettered horizontal.

For crossbar of e, top of g and t, top of d and elsewhere, first outline with the corner of the pen-point and then fill in. Twist stroke would suffice in more cursive texts.
